

Trevecca Nazarene University 2+2 Program

For students who plan to earn a bachelor's degree, the transition from Motlow State Community College to a university for the final two years can be quite easy. This plan is popularly known as the "2 + 2 model."

Advantages of the 2 + 2 Model

- **More affordable.** Community college is the most affordable form of college. Paying for 2 years of university is much less than paying for ALL 4 years!
- **You get the same results.** A university degree is a university degree. Whether you choose the 2 + 2 model or if you go directly to a four-year university, you will receive a bachelor's degree.
- **You get the same education.** The first two years of college (whether at a Motlow State Community College or at a four-year college or university) are focused on general education. Students take the math, science, and humanities classes that ALL graduates must take.
- **A smooth transition.** Motlow State Community College is a great place to start: classes are often smaller, professors spend more time with students, and students receive the support they need to become comfortable in a college setting.
- **Admission is guaranteed.** Motlow State Community College has agreements with the universities listed below. Students must simply take the required classes (and pass these classes) and then apply. Admission is guaranteed.

This agreement provides graduates a seamless transfer from Motlow State to the TNU Bachelor Degree in Management and Leadership (BML)

ON-SITE BACCALAUREATE DEGREE PROGRAM: Trevecca Nazarene University will provide academic credit courses for students on the Moore County campus of Motlow State Community College through the School of Graduate and Continuing Studies (SGCS).

TNU Responsibilities: The following duties will be the sole responsibility of TNU. TNU will:

- Provide faculty to teach courses.
- Require that the TNU curriculum be followed as outlined in the BML catalog.
- Require that students meet TNU admission requirements for acceptance into the BML Program as outlined in the BML Catalog.
- Register students for courses during the scheduled registration.
- Provide MSCC a list of courses to allow MSCC to assign each course a classroom.
- Provide clerical and support personnel to support the BML courses at MSCC.
- Provide academic advisement to enrolled students.

MSCC Responsibilities: The following duties will be the sole responsibility of MSCC. MSCC will:

- Provide information about classroom space available for the BML Program for timely publication of BML schedule.
- Provide access to parking and also accept TNU parking decals.

- Provide security.
- Provide library privileges.
- Assist TNU in publicizing classes to MSCC employees and graduates.
- Provide office space and access to telephone and internet on the campus of MSCC.

Mutual Agreements: both TNU and MSCC will cooperate to ensure that:

- All students must meet graduation requirements set by TNU.
- The Executive VP for Graduate and Continuing Studies at TNU and the Dean of the Moore County Campus at MSCC will be responsible for the administration of all responsibilities outlined.
